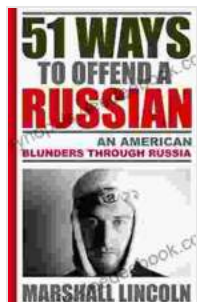

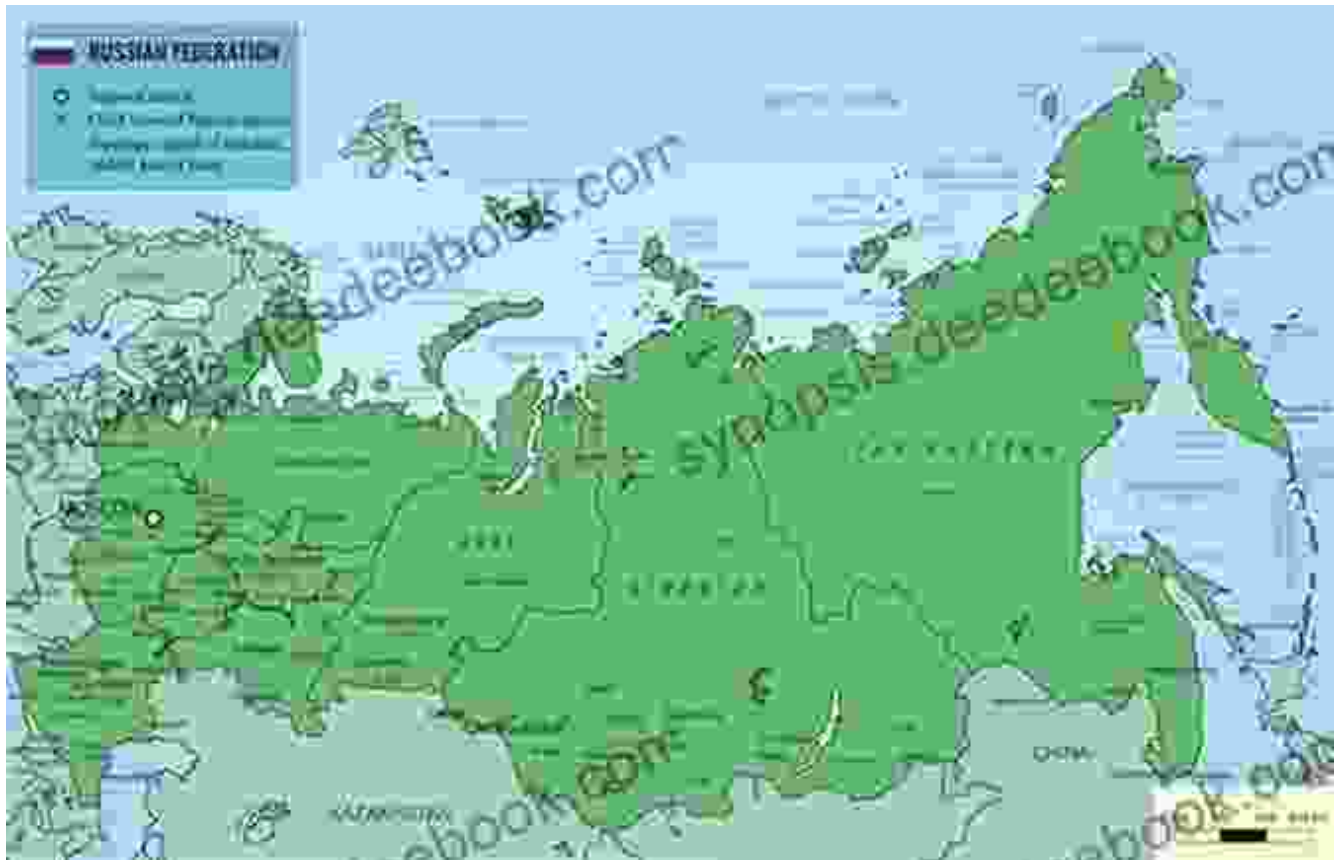

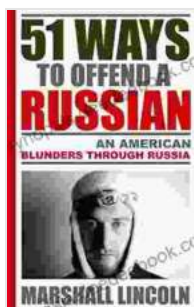
Here are a few tips for Americans traveling to Russia:

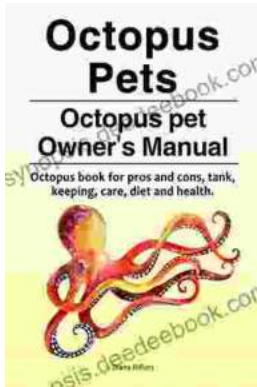

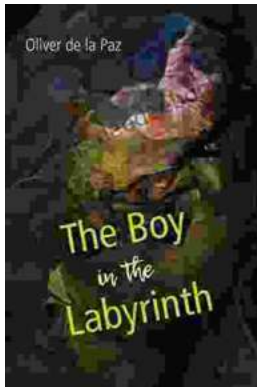
