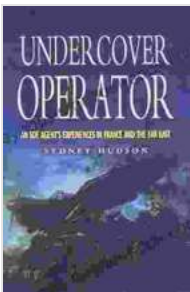


An Soe Agent's Extraordinary Experiences in France and the Far East: A Journey of Courage, Sacrifice, and Triumph

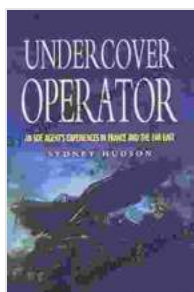

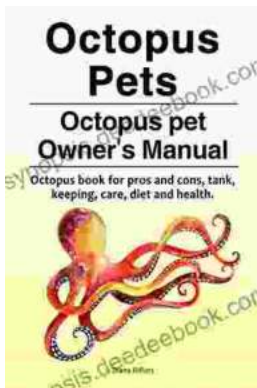

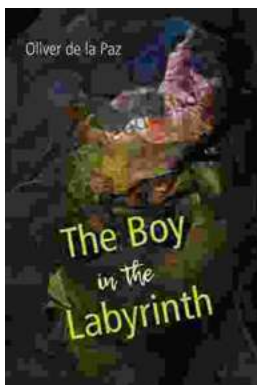
