
How Not to Write Great Lyrics: 40 Common Mistakes to Avoid

Here are 40 things to avoid when writing lyrics:

- Don't be too literal. Lyrics should be evocative and suggestive, not like a grocery list.
- 2. **Don't use clichés.** They're boring and overused.
- 3. **Don't be afraid to be specific.** Details will make your lyrics more interesting and memorable.
- 4. **Don't try to rhyme everything.** A forced rhyme can ruin a good lyric.

- 5. **Don't be too wordy.** Keep your lyrics concise and to the point.
- 6. **Don't make your lyrics too difficult to understand.** People should be able to get the gist of your song without having to read it twice.
- 7. **Don't write about things you don't know about.** If you're not familiar with a subject, your lyrics will sound fake and forced.
- 8. **Don't be afraid to experiment.** There's no one right way to write lyrics.
- 9. **Don't give up.** Writing great lyrics takes time and practice.
- 10. **Don't write lyrics that are too personal.** People may not relate to your experiences.
- 11. **Don't write lyrics that are too vague.** People need to be able to understand what you're talking about.
- 12. **Don't write lyrics that are too preachy.** People don't want to be lectured.
- 13. **Don't write lyrics that are too negative.** People want to be uplifted by music.
- 14. **Don't write lyrics that are too simplistic.** People want to be challenged by music.
- 15. **Don't use too many metaphors.** Metaphors can be confusing and distracting.

- 16. **Don't use too many similes.** Similes can be overused and boring.
- 17. Don't use too many clichés. Clichés are unoriginal and lazy.
- 18. **Don't use too much slang.** Slang can date your lyrics quickly.
- 19. **Don't use too many technical terms.** Technical terms can exclude people who don't know what you're talking about.
- 20. **Don't rhyme words that don't sound good together.** Rhyming "love" with "truck" is not a good idea.
- 21. **Don't use forced rhymes.** Forced rhymes can sound awkward and unnatural.
- 22. **Don't use too many rhymes.** Too many rhymes can make your lyrics sound sing-songy and childish.
- 23. **Don't use rhyme schemes that are too predictable.** Predictable rhyme schemes can be boring.
- 24. **Don't use rhyme schemes that are too complex.** Complex rhyme schemes can be difficult to understand and follow.
- 25. **Don't write lyrics that are too long.** Long lyrics can be difficult to sing and remember.
- 26. **Don't write lyrics that are too short.** Short lyrics can be unsatisfying and incomplete.

- 27. **Don't write lyrics that are too repetitive.** Repetitive lyrics can be boring and monotonous.
- 28. **Don't write lyrics that are too predictable.** Predictable lyrics can be boring and unexciting.
- 29. **Don't write lyrics that are too formulaic.** Formulaic lyrics can be unoriginal and boring.
