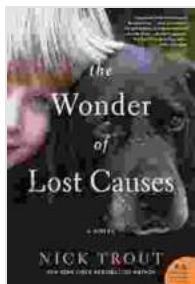

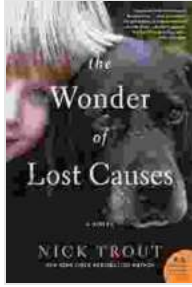
Author's Note

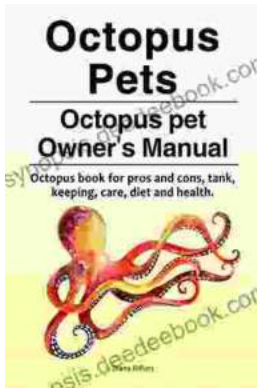

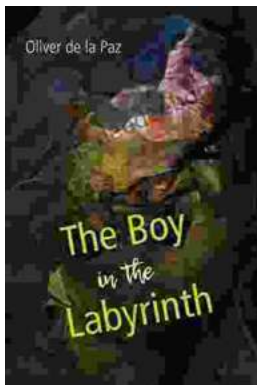
